Education Benefits:

Segal Education Award

- O After successfully completing your AmeriCorps term of service and enrolling in the National Service Trust, you are eligible to receive the Segal AmeriCorps Education Award. You can use the award to repay qualified student loans or to pay current educational expenses at eligible institutions of higher education or training programs. Members who are veterans can use their award at certain GI Bill-approved programs for veterans.
- O Eligible institutions of higher education can be domestic or foreign but must participate in the Department of Education's Title IV student aid programs. This includes most post-secondary colleges, universities, and technical schools.
- O The Value of a Segal Education Award: The amount of a full-time Segal AmeriCorps Education Award is equivalent to the maximum value of the Pell Grant for the fiscal year in which the term of national service is approved. The award amount varies based on the term of service completed. That is, the award will be larger for a year of full-time service than it will be for a year of three-quarter-, half-, or minimum-time service. Health Benefits:

Public Benefits: Depending upon your household size and income, you may be eligible for certain benefits available through the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS). These benefits are not funded through AmeriCorps, so eligibility is not guaranteed. If you encounter obstacles



applying for benefits or need documentation of your status as an AmeriCorps member, contact your program director for assistance.

SNAP: The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly known as "Food Stamps," is administered by IDHS and governed by federal law and the regulations of the



U.S. Department of Agriculture, Food Nutrition Services. SNAP provides monthly benefits to help eligible households buy food and seed/plants to grow food at home. Eligibility to receive benefits is based on household size, income, assets, and some household expenses, as determined by the federal government. Provides medical care to individuals who otherwise may not be able to afford it. A variety of services are provided, according to state and federal guidelines, depending upon the individual or family circumstances. Housing Choice Voucher Program:

If you need to find affordable housing for your service, the Housing Choice Voucher Program may be able to help you. The program offers rental assistance to extremely low to moderate-income residents. It also offers resources to help these families and individuals find decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market.
