On March 22, 2023, Serve Illinois Commission on Volunteerism and Community Service visited the Christ Our Light Catholic Church (formerly St. Florian) to recognize food pantry volunteers.

This food pantry has been in operation since 1992, with countless volunteers helping each week.

Volunteers meet weekly to set up, pack, and disperse essential food items for individuals who visit the food pantry and deliver to those who are unable to attend in person.

It is estimated that over 150 hours are put into volunteer work for the running of this pantry a week. The food is donated by the Chicago Food Depository.
